Concept 8 – Oversight Versus Over-Management

Concept 8 (Short Form) *The trustees are the principal planners and administrators of over-all policy and finance. They have custodial oversight of the separately incorporated and constantly active services, exercising this through their ability to elect all the directors of these entities.*

Continuing in the vein of Concepts 6 and 7, this Concept further defines the role of the General Service Board. Ever aware of the continuing danger to our Fellowship of the unchecked quest for money and authority, Bill W. writes in his essay on Concept 8, ***“However, experience dating from our earliest days strongly suggests that future Trustees and service workers, in the supposed interests of accounting simplicity, tax savings, and hoped-for efficiency, will be periodically tempted to go in for concentrations and consolidations of one kind or another. Should this be again attempted, we know that the risk of making an administrative shambles out of the total operation will be great indeed”***. Throughout the essay on Concept 8 Bill reinforces the idea that the best style of management for a business is, well, a type of business management. This Concept grants oversight of the two corporations wholly owned by A.A. – Alcoholics Anonymous World Services, (AAWS) and the Grapevine, Inc. directly to the General Service Board. It also instructs that the Board of Trustees should not and cannot be directly involved in the daily, weekly and monthly management of these two corporations. They are granted the power to elect the Directors of the corporations, (subject to approval by the General Service Conference), after which, the Trustees are instructed to “plan, manage and execute” their own duties and leave the management of the two corporations to the responsible boards.

As much as any other principle, this Concept has been directly responsible for allowing the entities of A.A. that are involved in business matters to manage those business affairs without constant second-guessing, (but, as you would expect, this still goes on, somewhat) and allows the Groups to tend to the matters of 12th Step work. This is where the material is truly separated from the spiritual. Now the real reason this Concept works is found in the next Concept – Concept 9. I’ll give you a hint – Concept 9 deals with Leadership.

When we work with others especially that newcomer that walks through that door confused, and befuddled not knowing where to go or what to do they start asking, and do not always get the most responsible answer.

The reason for this article is because I would love to see that new person that is vulnerable, and like a child, very impressionable, taught and handled responsibly. There are people in A.A. that think they know better than the doctors the Big Book tells me we know only a little, there is know where in the book, or any of our other literature that gives somebody the right to play doctor and say get off your medication you are not sober, or if you are on medication I will not sponsor you.

People have committed suicide because of those words, or wound up in long term mental Hospitals, I hear this stuff all the time makes me very sad I was at H & I recently and heard of somebody going to facility (Hospital) and told all the patients to get off their medication they lost their panel it made me ill, we need to be responsible I have a friend she is a new comer, she takes medication for anxiety she ask somebody to sponsor her that person said not until you get off your meds, she is taking it the way a doctor prescribed that is what I was always taught, and I am coming up on 26 years.

There is a pamphlet called (the AA member-medications & other Drugs) this was put together by physicians in A.A. there are several points we must follow when it comes to someone on medication: No A.A. member plays doctor. Be completely honest with yourself, and your doctor. These are just a couple of points, and they are in the front page.

This pamphlet is very informative when it comes to what is needed concerning prescribed medication. The book says sometimes we need to seek outside help. It is like telling somebody to stop taking medication for their heart, or insulin for diabetes. Unless you have a PhD or MD behind your name, I personally am not about to listen. It is called practicing medicine without a license. We need to be responsible for our own sobriety. (Responsibility is the key word.) If you're not sure how to work with others or sponsor someone properly read the sponsorship pamphlet, and working with others in the Big Book.





Contributions: the basics

First let me thank you and the groups of Area 9 for all you do to support 12 step work. Your contributions large and small allow us to reach out the hand of AA and keep the lines of communication open. That being said as an Area treasurer there are a few things I would like to explain:

Here's an example of what I need to see to ensure correct identification of your group:

Q: Why do you need all this information? A: To help make sure right group gets the credit

Q: What is GSO Number? GSO number is 13 digit number issued by General Service Office for groups, it is used by District, Area and GSO in communication with groups

Q: What does GSO number look like? Full number from GSO will look something like this:

000142143-09-12 which means group #142143 , area 09, district 12

Q: What information do I need? Group name, location, city , day + time, 6 digit GSO number

Name and address donation receipt is going to along with phone # or email if you wish.

I receive contributions every day with a cryptic note like "8pm women's group" with no

Location, city, day + time or GSO number. There are about 1400 registered groups in Area 9 and 5674 records in the area treasurer's data base, hard to find the right group in all that without something to point me

in the right direction! I also get donations without return or incorrect addresses so where do I send the receipt?

Q: How come receipt has "X" number?

A: See above, if your group is "unknown" or it has no GSO # it gets an "X" number.

Q: where should I put information? Include note or write GSO # on check with return address

Q: I let the central office know we changed our group information why hasn't it changed on my receipt from GSO, Area or district?

A: It's best to let all the entities know changes because we all have separate data bases and are autonomous.

Thank you in advance for using or passing along this information, that 6 digit GSO number is like a zip code in general service. It pinpoints your group in the database and speeds up the treasurer's job. I can find your group without it if you give me the other information like Group's Name, time and day you meet, meeting address. Every receipt sent back to you should have either the GSO number underlined or an X number explained above along with a receipt number and a date. Some people don't use the GSO number and send me something like "group #173" or "group 567F6" which as some of you know is a map location and not a group number. You would be surprised how many contributions I receive with no return address. Didn't get a receipt for a check you sent, might be I don't know where to send it. Here's a few stats your group might find interesting, number of donations processed in a year; 2405. Checks written; 305. Got any questions, suggestions or just want to say hi? Leadership vs Bleeding Deacons.

I will always be grateful for the love and tolerance I've received as an alcoholic. I am also grateful for those that have pointed out my mistakes or mistaken thinking. Bill said the good can be the enemy of the best and AA needs the best to ensure it's survival. Sometimes we as a group take the softer easier route to get things done. We elect those who may be willing but not able to fulfill their duties, sacrificing our principals to expedite our desires. As I've said many times before God qualifies the called but you have to give him something to work with! There are reasons we have qualifications for positions and experience in another position is encouraged. How would you like some one to take you through the steps that hasn't done them themselves? AA is not like the government I hope that promotes the inept; it takes more then a good smile to serve. Humility and an ability to communicate the language of the heart are what I look for. I don't need a salesman or manager, just an alcoholic with a desire and ability to serve. In the service manual it describes the qualities of true leaders: *"Good leadership never passes the buck. Another qualification for leadership is give and take, the ability to compromise cheerfully whenever a proper compromise can cause a situation to progress in what appears to be in the right direction. We cannot, however, compromise always. Now and then it is truly necessary to stick flat-footed to one's conviction about an issue until it is settled."* When I look for leaders I look for people with qualities I admire and would wish to emulate. People who embody our code of love and tolerance while being living examples of our steps and traditions. Quiet, humble people as opposed to the "politico" it describes in Concept 9 of the service manual. *"A politico is an individual who forever trying to 'get the people what they want'."* It also says that rotating leadership is best and that is a quality I deeply admire, the ability to let go of a position and "pass it on". It says somewhere in our literature a Bleeding deacon is one who is constantly contriving to hold or get reelected to one position or another because they don't believe we can get along with out them. I love General Service but

I understand you got along fine before I got here and you'll be fine after I leave. One can never say we lack personality in General Service, it's principles we sometimes lack. The principle of taking an informed group conscience, the principle of having a careful and honest discussion with all voices heard the principle of agreeing to disagree in a respectful manner.

Yet no matter how much my actions say to the contrary some question my motives and my faith in the program of Alcoholics Anonymous. I put my faith in God and the 12 steps, not personalities. Some want to go to work to provide the services described in the service manual, while others say "Gee Ma, ain't it great the wind stop blowing?" I believe that in General Service we have to live these 36 principles and strive for improvement as individuals, groups and Area. We must take our time to make sure the decisions we make are the best for AA as a whole. We are given great responsibility, to choose our trusted servants, our leaders. If we choose based on who we like rather then what is best for AA as a whole we do a disservice to ourselves as well as our groups. Someone said to me "You attract more flies with honey then vinegar", well BS seems to attract flies too! I didn't get into AA to be popular or attract flies; I'm here to be of service and to give something back. Some of the people I disagree with are the most fun because at least they're honest as opposed to those that smile to your face and practice character assassination behind your back. Sometimes I get in trouble for saying what I think but thankfully you've taught me to admit when I'm wrong. There are times I wish everything were as simple as the Bleeding Deacons make it out to be but alas they are not. If we want AA to grow we need to make hard choices and thoughtful choices. If you want to be one of the flies go for whatever the Bleeding Deacons offer, if you want to be of service then use the brain God gave you and make wise choices. Leadership is absolutely vital to the Area's future which is why Bill included a description of leadership in the service manual. We can either ignore the problems we have or with proper leadership tackle those problems together.
