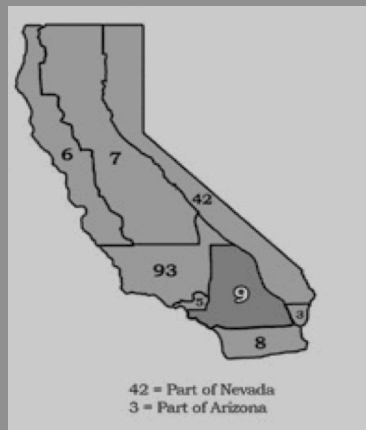

RE: Petition for Bill Wilson's commemorative Stamp

Dear Friends:

Warm Greetings from G.S.O.!

We have recently been made aware of an effort made by several non-A.A. organizations who have petitioned the U.S. Postal Service to develop a Bill Wilson commemorative stamp (a photo of Bill). The copy of their petition that was forwarded to us also suggested that if such a stamp is created, it would be "unveiled during the 2015 International Convention of Alcoholics Anonymous in Atlanta, GA (July 2-5, 2015)."

We are writing to let you know that the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous and the General Service Office, which coordinate the International Convention, have not been contacted directly regarding this. Furthermore, there are no such plans in place, nor will there be, to include this as part of our upcoming convention.

A letter to the appropriate department at the U.S. Postal Service has been dispatched, explaining our principle of anonymity, and clarifying that this effort is not endorsed or supported by Alcoholics Anonymous.

As you all know, our organization cherishes the principle of personal anonymity of our members, both living and deceased. Our founders believed, as Bill said in a letter to a newspaper editor in 1950, that "personal success in the A.A. program requires humility, that we have no right to claim distinction for the gift of sobriety."

Bill W. wrote that before Dr. Bob died, they both firmly agreed that neither one of them would accept public honors for A.A. work. Bill felt that "such an example, set before future generations of power-driving A.A. members, might prove to be worth more than any prestige which such honors could confer upon either of us. This was our estimate, and I still believe it to be the right one." (Letter, February 1960)

M\$CA Budget: How it comes to be...

To: MSCA members
From: MSCA Finance Committee

August 11, 2013: Budget Request and Inventory worksheets are distributed to each Area Officers and Committee Chair at the Area Service Committee (**ASC**).

September 8, 2013: Each Area Officer and Committee Chair has returned his/her completed budget request and inventory worksheets by or on this date (**Area Assembly**)

October 20, 2013: Initial budget preparation meeting held at the MSCA Archives in Riverside. Participants are: members of the Finance Committee, the current Delegate, and the newly elected Treasurer and Delegate. Budget requests are reviewed along with spending in 2013 to plan a preliminary 2014 budget. This initial budget will be posted on the Area website.

November 10, 2013: Initial budget is presented to the Area Service Committee (**ASC**); questions on the budget will be answered.

November 11 - 30, 2013: Initial budget is reviewed by the Executive Committee and are revisions presented to the Finance Committee. If the budget is revised, the revised planned budget will be posted on the Area website.

December 8, 2013: Preliminary budget is presented a second time (with any revisions requested by the Area Executive Committee) at the **ASC**. Members of the ASC discuss and vote on sending the budget to the January Assembly.

January 12, 2014: The final budget, with year-end revisions*, if any, is presented to the Area Assembly by the Executive Committee. The Assembly votes on acceptance of a final budget, following discussion and suggested revisions in distribution, if any.

*** If there are unused funds in the bank account at the end of 2013 (in other words, if we did not break even) that amount will be added to the 2014 budget as equitably as possible. Remember, we will not know the amount of those funds until that first week in January. Therefore, the amounts you see in the initial budget in November may not be the same amounts of the final budget in January. The members at the Assembly will have opportunity to discuss and make suggested changes to the distribution of the projected budget at the January assembly.**

Needed: Panel 64 Area Newsletter Sub-Committee Chair aka Editor

Area Newsletter Sub-Committee Chair does not need to compose the newsletter personally, but needs to assure that it is done and oversees the content and composition. Think about it.

MAY 2013 SPONSORSHIP WORKSHOP

Presented jointly by MSCA Districts 10 & 15
Below are some of the suggested responses to the six workshop questions...

Q. What should a Sponsee look for in a Sponsor?

A. Look for someone who:

- is sober
- continues thoroughly working 12 Steps
- has something (sobriety/serenity) that you want to have.
- is truthful, honest and upfront
- has integrity and walks the walk
- keeps things confidential—not a gossip
- networks in A.A.
- holds one accountable/structure
- is approachable
- has good knowledge of the 12 Steps
- is spiritually-minded/God-centered
- has a sponsor
- you can relate with
- is compatible with you
- is of service
- has time for sponsorship
- you can't bulls---
- is the same sex as you are
- gives good direction that works

Q. When am I ready to be a sponsor?

A. Consider these suggestions:

- ask your sponsor
- when I'm ready to listen
- when I have worked all 12 steps
- Bill W. and Dr. Bob told their sponsees to look for new-comers right away
- God will tell you when you are ready
- it's hard to be brave enough
- check your motives
- disappointing when sponsees flake
- read Sponsorship pamphlet and if you can answer yes, you're on the right track.
- when you have had a spiritual awakening
- "I can't understand the walk if I'm not walking."
- check that the new person is willing to go to any length to stay sober.
- check that the new person is willing to follow direction.
- willingness
- "I was told that if I have one day I can be of service"
- "My sponsor was my example."

Q: How do I change sponsors?

A: Some suggestions are

- be honest with the previous sponsor and thank them for their help
- if a sponsor is not OK with you changing, then you probably made the right choice to get a new sponsor
- ask for someone to be a temporary sponsor
- sometimes the change is mutually beneficial
- preferably do this in person (no text or voicemail)
- sometimes concerns of the health of sponsor cause you to want to change
- changing is about setting boundaries and checking your motives for changing
- important that new sponsor understands Traditions and concepts.

Q. What are the boundaries of sponsorship: do's and don'ts

A. Common sense and the program suggest some of the following

- Medication: we are not doctors in A.A. Tell them they should take meds only as prescribed by a doctor. OK to tell them that Nyquil has alcohol in it.
- Money: if you give, don't expect it back. We don't carry the alcoholic; we carry the message. "I didn't appreciate the things I didn't earn."
- Forcing: Guide them...don't tell them what to do.
- Discuss and set boundaries from the beginning.
- You will probably make mistakes with your first sponsee; you will learn.

Q. What is a Service Sponsor?

A. Someone who

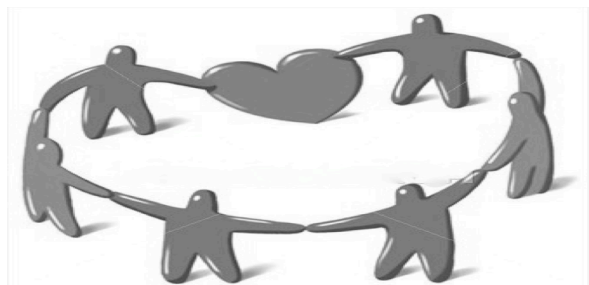
- introduces a sponsee to a variety of service and trusted servants, available positions.
- explains the importance of service so "the hand of AA is always there"
- has experience and will sit next to us in a business meeting, explain guidelines, formats, lingo, acronyms.
- will explain/introduce us to the 12 Concepts
- might say, "Get in the car." "Greeters don't get drunk." Under commit but over deliver."
- explains the importance of temporary service sponsors.
- helps to guard against over commitment and/or burnout.

Q. How does a sponsor handle the overly dependent sponsee?

A. Sponsor might consider

- am I (the sponsor) co-dependent? Am I coming from love and faith or fear?
- making clear agreements about expectations on both sides.
- keeping communications open.
- asking him/herself, "Did my sponsee call 1-3 other people before calling me?"
- look carefully at my own issues.
- can an overly dependent sponsee exist without a sponsor's codependence or allowance?
